What is the Sports Premium?

The government has provided funding of £150 million pounds per annum for PE and sports in primary schools. The funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Schools are free to determine how best to use the funding to improve the PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

The Sports Premium can only be used for Sport and PE provision in schools.

How do we plan to use the Sports Premium at Thomas Willingale School?

ALLOCATION OF SPORTS' PREMIUM GRANT (2025/26)

The governors and staff agreed that the funding should be used to enhance our current provision and develop staff skills so that they can deliver quality lessons for all children regardless of their ability. We intend to continue giving enhanced provision. We will also be attending competitions organised by the West Essex School Sports' Partnership, as this gives not only our most able pupils opportunities to compete, but other pupils too, including those with special educational needs and disabilities. We are committed to the Sports Partnership and value their expertise in training staff and competition provision.
