Our school music development plan is to ensure 'rich and memorable' provision for every child in music at Thomas Willingale School and Nursery that encourages them to REFLECT on how music makes them and others feel, be CURIOUS about musicians, music from other cultures and how music can change lives, be RESPONSIBLE for instruments and know how to care for them and develop RESILIENCE when learning to play instruments and learn notation.

Ofsted have stated that "We will not always know the learning outcomes" so segregated learning objectives at the start of each lesson are not appropriate. **Musical teaching and learning is not neat or linear**, children do not learn in straight lines. The strands of musical learning, presented within the lesson plans and the on-screen resources, are part of the learning spiral. Over time, children develop new musical skills and concepts, and also revisit established musical skills and concepts. **Repeating a musical skill doesn't mean their progress is slowing down or their development is moving backwards**; it enables them to reenforce their musical understanding in order to improve the quality of their musicianship. To achieve mastery means gaining both a deeper understanding of musical skills and concepts and learning something new.
