Fair Trade

I think this business is unfair because the CEO gets paid a huge salary of £4,000,000 per year, whereas the plantation workers only receive £1,068 per year. It is unfair because the plantation workers have a lot of things to do, like watering bananas and making the bananas perfect to eat. While the CEO only works on a computer, talking and typing to make the business perfect. Whilst this is still hard work it is not the same as being out in the fields each day and that is what makes the business a success. I personally think that they are still missing something very important FAIR TRADE. Fair trade is a worldwide movement which aims to help famers in developing countries receive a fair price for the things they sell. Fair trade is very important to the plantation workers because they have to provide food for the children, themselves and their family. Also, they have a lot of responsibilities like keeping a house, paying taxes, the electricity and any other bills. With the money the CEO gives them they can barely afford a house so that would mean that they cannot properly afford necessities. If the Chiquita Bananas business was a fair-trade company, then there would be more money to pay the plantation workers, and it would be fairer.

Need and Deserve

I personally think that fairness is based on two words need and deserve. Need is like food and water you need them to live and deserve is when you have done something

good, so you get something in return for doing well, like getting an 'A' in maths or cleaning the house. So, these are the two words that I think are most important to fairness. Also, they are very important because often children say, 'I need a new toy' when adults need their money to pay the bills.

In some of our tutorials we looked at a 'Human Rights' poster. Human rights are when we all get treated the same and fairly. These are some examples; no-one has the right to hold you in slavery, or you have the right to vote for who you want for your country. . You can use this story in relation to a real life example. In some countries, people give money to the government to pay for things like healthcare treatments. This is paid to the government as a percentage of their wages. So, the more you earn the more you must give to the government. Some people pay more money than others even though they don't have to work as hard and those who don't work as hard still get the healthcare, even though they didn't give as much money to it. This is not always fair, but it means that the people with the most money can help the people who don't make as much. The people with the most money don't always need all their money.
